A Sigma Chi Until the White Rose Drops

Robert Lehmkuhl's Life Changed Forever the Day He Knocked on the Chapter House Door

Robert Lehmkuhl '74 had his life changed forever the day he walked up to the house at 4600 Norwich Road with the white cross in front of it and knocked on the door. "As an out-of-state student at the University of Maryland, there was no housing for me in the fall of 1970, so I had to find my own way," he said.

Robert's sister, a Gamma Phi Beta, suggested he try the Sigma Chi fraternity, and that's how he ended up at the door of the Sigma Chi house one day. "I knocked on the door, but was told to come in through the front window," he said. "The brothers who were playing Risk on the living room floor told me to go down the hallway and see the Quaestor to put my name on the list as a boarder. I paid my bill in full and, just like that, I had a room for the semester," he said.

If there hadn't been any rooms available, Robert said he may have ended up at the University of Texas or Utah. "My life was changed forever that day!" he exclaimed.

He pledged the fraternity that fall and was initiated on February 6, 1971. "Life was great living in the house for four years, including summers. I got jobs with the other brothers to make money for tuition, room and board, and dues. There were no student loans back then, so you either made ends meet or went to Vietnam," he said.

But the brothers relied on each other to get work and earn money. "My pledge brother, Jim, got me a job at his parents' house cutting

grass for the summer. It was the best summer ever and he became a lifelong brother," he said.

Even after graduation, brothers continued to provide Robert with professional opportunities. "My first job after graduation came from a brother named Doug, who needed reliable laborers to build swimming pools," he said. "Then, my first corporate job and career, which lasted for 20 years, came from another brother, also named Doug," he said.

Because of all this, Robert has no idea where he might be if he hadn't joined Sigma Chi. "It's corny, but

there are many paths in life. A phone call, a girlfriend, an accident, or a death could send you in a completely different direction. I don't know how my life would have turned out if the brothers at Sigma Chi hadn't accepted me into their fraternity and helped me get through the difficult times in life, but I know I will be a Sigma Chi until the White Rose drops," he said.

So, that house on Norwich Road that Robert boldly knocked on one fall day in 1970, desperate just to find a place to stay, became so much more than that. The house, and the fraternity, was Robert's home. "When people ask where I grew up, I always say the Sigma Chi fraternity house," he said.

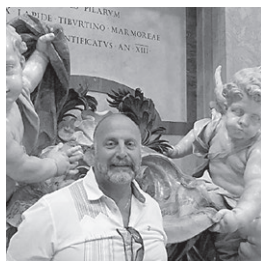
Sigma Chi days and they are the only alums I really stay in touch with. I'm currently working in NYC for KPMG. I have two kids and a beautiful wife.
