SIGMA CHI FRATERNITY HAS ENRICHED MY LIFE BEYOND MEASURE David Crow '52

Recently, we reached out to **David Crow '52** to ask about his time in Sigma Chi, and the lasting impact that it made on his life. An accomplished author, David shared his story with us, in his own words.

"I pledged Sigma Chi out of sheer luck, which was pure good luck. A high school classmate told me to walk down to the Sigma Chi house and introduce myself. He said to show up for dinner at 6 PM.

I arrived for dinner at 6:20 PM, and dinner was over. I walked outside and ran into a brother named Tony Ristaino. We laughed about dinner being finished already, but our conversation went on for another 30 minutes. He invited me to a pledge function, and from that moment on, I wanted to be part of Sigma Chi. Over 50 years later, I still do.

Our house was at 4600 Norwich Road, just behind Fraternity Row. It was a large three-story house with a great living room, dining room, party room, and chapter room. It was an old house, but we maintained it well. There are so many great memories at the house, including initiation, parties, serious chapter meetings, and many festive occasions. Sigma Chi was the lifeblood of my college experience, and I cannot imagine life without it. My initiation was the highlight. When the chapter was asked 'Who vouches for this man?' The answer, 'We all do.' I will always remember that.

Sigma Chi offered a tremendous education separate from the classes at the University of Maryland. We learned to live with men of different temperaments, talents, and convictions. Our members came from a wide variety of family experiences. We were richer for becoming brothers in such a diverse group. I knew they would be friends and brothers for life, and they have been.

I believe Sigma Chi offers a tremendous amount to every member from our beginning in the 1850s to the present day and beyond. College should be about opening a student's mind to knowledge, friendship, responsibility, and belonging. Sigma Chi did that for me and a whole lot more. All of the brothers I know feel the same way.

I have mentored dozens of Sigma Chis as interns in my lobbying firm, DCLRS. Many have been the children of brothers of my era, but even more have come from the current undergraduate ranks. My lobbying firm has had approximately 300 interns in my 33 1/2 years of managing this firm, and many are Sigma Chis. It feels great helping these young men prepare for careers. Our firm has been able to offer letters of recommendation, law school references, and advice from nearly 50 years in the lobbying world. Let me add, today's graduates are far better equipped than I was. They have all been impressive, and it makes me feel great that the next generation of leaders will be up to the task of making this world better. It means everything to give back. It means you have an appreciation for all that was given to you.

Without Sigma Chi, my life would have been poorer in more ways than I can count. To say it differently, the Sigma Chi fraternity has enriched my life beyond measure. I am deeply proud of being a member and hope to help as many members as possible in my journey.

Let me add that I wrote a memoir, *The Pale-Faced Lie*, which has become a best seller. In it, I list seven angels who intervened to make my life better. I list Sigma Chi as one of my angels, a crucial one in a life that could have gone very wrong."

George Henry Albrecht

Brother George Henry Albrecht served in the US military during the Vietnam War. George was born in 1931, and in 1964, he registered for military service. He was from western Pennsylvania, and he was initiated in our Fraternity in 1950.



Brother Joseph H Gollner served in the Korean War after graduating from the Naval Academy in 1949, where he was assigned to pilot the AD-4 aircraft.

Joseph was born in West Virginia, but eventually moved to Maryland. Prior to his time in the Naval Academy, Joseph was initiated in our Fraternity in 1946.



On November 19th, 1964, Brother Albrecht died in Vietnam at 33 years old, and was later buried in Arlington, VA.



Brother Joseph died on January 11, 1952, while flying off the East Coast of Korea. He was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for "extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial flight while serving with Fighter Squadron FIFTY-FOUR (VF-54), embarked in U.S.S. ESSEX (CV-9), in action against enemy aggressor forces in Korea on October 29, 1951."
